"Tetélestai" (Greek meaning "It is finished") is a contemporary musical passion play about the last week in Jesus' life. The ministry vividly portrays His triumphant entry into Jerusalem, His trial, execution and His resurrection.

Cleveland Performing Arts Ministries is a non-profit organization that produces "Tetélestai" in Northeastern Ohio. The play originated in the minds of two young college students, Russ and Joel Nagy from Upper Arlington Lutheran Church in Columbus, Ohio. Under the direction of the Holy Spirit, Russ composed the contemporary music score, while Joel put the script and lyrics together by laying out the Gospels side-by-side. They depicted the words and actions of Jesus in an historically accurate setting with a contemporary message for today's audience.

No tickets, but a free-will offering will be collected at each of the three performances.





WORSHIP TEAM
